Agatha Christie's home Greenway (TQ5 0ES) is high on the left bank of the River Dart, it has a railway station on the heritage line but trains don't stop there routinely. www.nationaltrust.org.uk/greenway

Other National Trust properties, include: Cotehele and its quay (PL12 6TA) Morwellham Quay (PL19 8JL) Buckland Abbey (PL20 6EY), the home of Francis Drake

Dartington Hall (TQ9 6EL) renowned radical college for the Arts and Social Sciences, is beside the River Dart boasts pleasant grounds and has a medieval hall, ancient jousting yard, restaurant pub and small cinema. <u>www.dartington.org/visit/</u>

Dartington Craft Centre, just outside Totnes, offers cafés, shops and an extensive Craft Centre and Dartington Glass outlet <u>www.visitdartington.co.uk</u>

Totnes is a centre of alternative medicine has a castle and quaint shops.

Bovey Tracey (TQ13 9AF) is home to the Devon Guild of Craftsmen, an extensive craft shop with café.
